PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we the Catholic Parish of St. Ann embrace all as family & continue Christ's mission by exemplifying the love of God & neighbor as stewards of God's gifts to us.

MARRIAGES:

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least **One Year** before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

BAPTISM:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes **6 months** of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

LAZARUS MINISTRY:

Lazarus Ministry contacts and helps families of deceased parishioners. Providing greeters at funeral liturgies, preparing meals and house sitting are several ways parishioners assist families. Also, a Mass of Remembrance is held every November for those deceased that year.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - AUGUST 23, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This time next year, the Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro will have just finished and the world will be waiting for the start of the Paralympic Games on September 7th. The Olympics generate a global fascination long before the athletes begin to arrive in the country where they will take place. There is also much talk about the legacy that will remain after the closing ceremony. London 2012 produced impressive facilities, regenerated the local area and left behind a futuristic sculpture.

Of all Olympic events, the marathon probably requires the most endurance. A road race of slightly more than twenty-six miles, its origin lies in ancient history. The legend tells that 1,525 years ago, a Greek by the name of Pheidippides ran that distance to tell the people of Athens that their army had just beaten the Persians in a three-day battle at Marathon. He had two possible routes: one was approximately thirty-five miles long and safer; the other was about twenty-six miles and included a very steep hill. We do not know which road Pheidippides selected, but tradition says that he ran without stopping. When he reached Athens, Pheidippides passed on the message of the victory and then collapsed and died. When the Olympics were held in Athens in 2004, athletes ran the marathon along the same route that Pheidippides is believed to have taken.

In today's Gospel Lesson, Jesus watches as many of his followers abandon him, unable to accept the challenge he has just presented. He has just told them that he is the bread of life, which will sustain them until they reach the kingdom of God. Perhaps the crowds misunderstand his words and take them literally as he speaks of eating his flesh and drinking his blood. Perhaps they are just unprepared to take on the demands of discipleship. As they leave Jesus, he tells them that his words are spirit and life, but those same words fall on deaf ears.

Did Jesus think that his closest friends were also ready to abandon him? He gave them their option: they could go or they could stay, but he could not change his message or his identity. Messengers who, to keep people happy, arbitrarily alter the contents of their communication are not worth hearing. Jesus would not water down his teaching to suit the audience. Perhaps this made the disciples

appreciate his vulnerability but also his strength and integrity. However difficult it was to understand what Jesus had just said, he had spoken a truth that they must trust would become clearer with time. If they were to leave Jesus, they had no further alternatives: in abandoning truth, they would accept what was false. The disciples made their decision. Jesus was the Holy One of God and they would follow him, however difficult the journey might become.

If Pheidippides had studied the difficult road between the victory over the Persian army at Marathon and the waiting, anxious people of Athens, he might never have started his epic run. Had he known that the journey would kill him, he might never have made the effort to run the whole distance. His message was of success and glory for his people with a promise of future security. Pheidippides' heart gave out only in a physical sense: his courage, self-sacrifice and integrity are immortal.

Olympic and Paralympic athletes only reach the Games because of their continuing determination to do the very best that they can. That is why they often talk more of their "personal best" than of their position in the final results. This is also why many athletes are surprisingly humble about their achievements, recognising where they could have done better just as much as seeing where they have performed well. In a very real sense, these people are ambassadors and role models for others.

Jesus knew that his would be a hard act to follow. Nobody would find it easy to imitate his willingness to give his all, both to his Father and for his people. Where do I stand? Do I choose the easy path, even if it leads me further from God? Or do I opt for a life with Jesus, which might be harder and raise more questions but which, in the long run, brings heavenly happiness and joy?

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely—visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died. Also, pray for the souls of all the faithful departed of our Parish Family.

May God always be pleased with us!

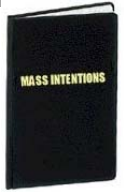

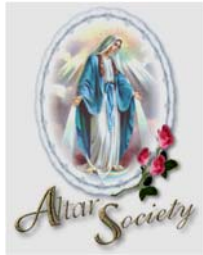

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

Vacation is over and days preparing for the return of the children are the order of business. Books, supplies, tuition payments, registrations, and teachers are arriving every day. As I tour the school, I am exciting about the changes I see.

Kudos goes out to our maintenance staff. The smell of a clean building greets you as soon as you open the front door. They have also diligently arranged classrooms to teacher specifications. Their next project is the stage and gym floor.

Our technology wizard has been hard at work as well. Each classroom has been equipped with a new up-to-date computer. My favorite part is that the computers in the classrooms are now wireless. Teacher desks hold a keyboard and a new monitor that are wireless, allowing the teacher to use the computer without turning her back on the class. These items take up less room than a textbook leaving her desk free for other teacher work and activities. The second advantage is that the computers designated for student use have students facing the monitor in a position which allows the teacher to clearly see and supervise student activities without having to break the cycle of instruction for the rest of the class. The teacher can now see all screens from the front of the room.

We received a donation of computer webcams which have also been installed in the lab and in each class. Under teacher directions, students can interact with educational institutions all over the world. This will broaden student experiences and venues for learning.

The school has contracted with a new cafeteria service. The menu offers greater variety and more daily choices, wholesome healthy selections that are also kid friendly, and is a better fit for the needs of our school. I know the children will be happy with the addition of a dessert selection. Having a sweet tooth, I appreciate this as well.

St. Ann School continues to offer a unique, special, totally Catholic education. We are here in the name of Jesus to serve His beloved children. 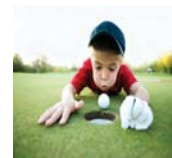
