PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we the Catholic Parish of St. Ann embrace all as family & continue Christ's mission by exemplifying the love of God & neighbor as stewards of God's gifts to us.

MARRIAGES:

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least **One Year** before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

BAPTISM:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes **6 months** of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

LAZARUS MINISTRY:

Lazarus Ministry contacts and helps families of deceased parishioners. Providing greeters at funeral liturgies, preparing meals and house sitting are several ways parishioners assist families. Also, a Mass of Remembrance is held every November for those deceased that year.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK:

Parishioners who are homebound are visited on the first Friday of each month by our Deacons & Religious. If you know of a parishioner that is seriously ill or hospitalized, please call the rectory.

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - AUGUST 30, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The story is told of a holy abbot who for many years was the proud owner of a pet cat, which had strayed one day into the monastery, though no one knew from where. Whenever the abbot went to pray, especially if it was for a long liturgical service, he would gently tether the cat in the entrance to the chapel so that it couldn't run away. He had done this for many years and, when eventually he died, his former companions felt they must continue the custom. As soon as they gathered for worship one of their number would ensure that the cat was present in the doorway. But, of course, eventually all the monks who had known the old abbot died. Finally the cat---who had lived to a great age for a cat---died too. It was decided that the ancient custom must be maintained, and so another cat was acquired and duly posted at the chapel door at the start of every service.

The years went by and one day a new recruit, quite a young man, joined the monastery. He was intrigued by the cat's presence and asked one of the older monks for an explanation. "Strange you should ask," he replied, "but, do you know, I have no idea. It's just that this is the way we've always done things here."

Customs, traditional ways of doing things, are part and parcel of every society, including every religious community. They can be extremely useful, but over time they can become pointless. They can even become dangerous---especially if they're clung to blindly, without any thought of what lies behind them, or of their probable consequences or of the possibility that there might be a more helpful way of doing things.

In today's Old Testament Lesson Moses commands the people to follow their God-given "laws and customs". In the Gospel Lesson the Pharisees and scribes complain to Jesus that his disciples are eating with unwashed hands, and so are not complying with the Law. They mean that the disciples are ignoring some of the prescriptions that the scribes and Pharisees had added to the Law over the centuries. These regulations were not concerned with health and safety but with ritual purity: the washings of everyday things and of human limbs rendered them ritually clean, uncontaminated, fit, the Pharisees thought, for the service of God.

Jesus at once goes onto the attack. He is not suggesting that matters of ritual purity are of no value, but he does insist that there are other things of greater importance. With a quotation from the prophet Isaiah, he claims that the Pharisees are hypocrites: they are actors, showmen, who offer lip service to the Lord while in fact their hearts are far from him; their service is worthless. In clinging to human regulations rather than to the Law itself, they are burdening people with unreasonable demands, and in some cases are actually nullifying God's law. Finally, he explains that if they want to know what truly makes people "unclean", then they should look, not to what goes into the stomach, but what emerges from the heart. It is the human heart that is the source of uncleanness, of "evil intentions".

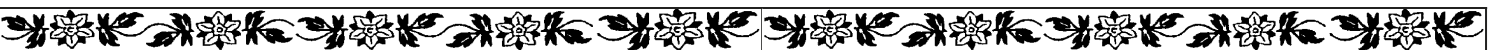
Today's Lessons prompt us to examine our attitude towards our own religious customs and practices. We too can become rigid and narrow; we can behave like the Pharisees of old. We can be loath to accept any changes in what we've been used to; even changes that have been approved by the Church, changes made because circumstances have changed or because former practices have been replaced by more helpful ones. Whenever people resist change---"on principle", as they often say---there is almost always a lack of humility. We're all prone to a stubbornness that clings to the assumption that our way of doing things is the best way---the only way.

Jesus ends the controversy in today's Gospel Lesson by insisting that the heart is the source of "evil things"; but, by implication, it is also the source of good things. Jesus wants a heart that is humble, a heart that knows its own limitations, a heart that is ready to accept change when change is called for, a heart that is in fact like unto his own; he calls us to be, like him, "gentle and humble in heart".

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely---visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died. Also, pray for the souls of all the faithful departed of our Parish Family.

This year the church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday 2015 on Sunday, September 20, 2015.

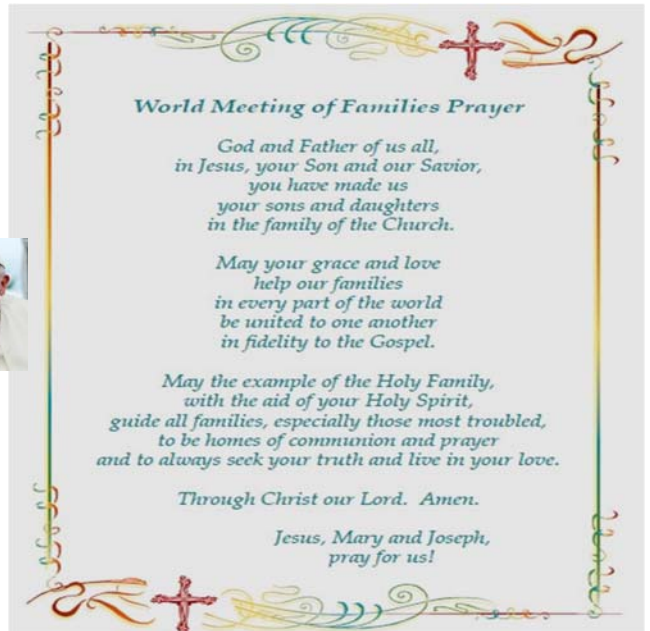

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

Attired in shorts, tee shirts, and flip flops, 'the saints are marching in!' No, I am not referring to our students, though their growth in holiness is paramount to us. I am referring to the return of the teaching staff.

Rested and relaxed, they unpacked books and worked on schedules. This week was a week of meetings. I often wonder what the non-teacher thinks happens at these meetings.

We went through the new, different, special assignments, calendars, and introductions. We reviewed the goals set for the year and how to meet those goals. Small groups of teachers met to mentor new teachers and to further plan special events. That was just on Tuesday.

Wednesday, was a day of retreat. This set the entire faculty with the knowledge that this school exists for more than public education with Catholic values. Msgr. Michael Corona, our pastor, began with a special Mass just for the faculty. He then reminded them of their call as teachers for Christ. He developed this theme throughout the day with talks and activities. With Monsignor's blessing, the teachers were renewed in the grace of their vocation and invigorated to begin their holy task once again.

Thursday was a day of solid professional development. Teachers participated in three technology based programs to address some of our goals. Creating a learning environment that invites, motivates, and challenges each student was the focus of the first conference. This was followed by a sharing and coaching experience. Student engagement was our next focus. From the Master Teacher Series, this assisted teachers in seeing a host of possibilities for student activities that encourage students to achieve and exceed anticipated learning outcomes. After lunch, our final session dealt with teacher use of technology in the classroom. A guest consultant broadened the base of teacher technology skills and shared further ways that technology can enhance student learning experiences.

September 1 is right around the corner. Teachers with plans in hand, curriculum guides, seating charts, and hearts ready to embrace God's children will welcome these young souls to their second home on this day. Please pray for us as we begin this sacred work.
