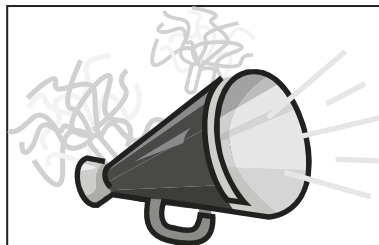

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Mountains and hills that stretch into the far distance, arid desert or uncultivated vegetation, vast areas and wild places inhabited only by wildlife, if inhabited at all – these are all images of the wilderness. Either you will be deterred by the wilderness, perhaps through fear of the unknown; or, enticed by its mystery, you will want to enter in and attempt to discover its secrets.

In his book *Wilderness Walks* Cameron McNeish, who has climbed and trekked in wilderness throughout the world, describes the wilderness as a world of peace and beauty, space and silence, “far away from the stresses and problems of everyday life”. He recalls that when he was fourteen he saw two men scrambling down from high crags above a Scottish glen, one with a coiled rope over his shoulder, both suntanned, lean, relaxed in their movements and “completely at home in that wild environment”. To his young eyes, they were like “gods descending from Olympus” and he determined there and then that he wanted to be like them and to be a part of that same environment. Since then mountains and wilderness have never disappointed him, and he suggests that this is because wild places fulfil a need deep within us.

The wilderness sets the scene of today’s Gospel Lesson. John the Baptist fulfils Isaiah’s prophecy that a voice will cry, “In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD!” John also fulfils a deep need within the people to hear the true word of God. They know that John’s words are no mere lip service to God. He “tells it as it is”; he eats only to live; what he eats and what he wears are provided by the natural world. In him the people see an authentic messenger of God in whom they can believe, and their hearts are moved. John deflects their hopes away from himself to “one mightier than I [who] is coming after me”. We can imagine the buzz of expectancy that accompanied the vast crowds as they moved into the wilderness to confess their sins and be washed in the waters of the Jordan in a baptism of repentance and forgiveness.

The location of John’s preaching also fulfils a need, within a people who were oppressed, to acknowledge publicly the history of their salvation in God. For it was after years in the wilderness that the people of Israel had first entered the Promised Land through the miraculously divided waters of the Jordan. The wilderness or desert had been their birthplace as the people of God and so it was a special part of their history. But it was not a place of beauty or peace set aside from the stresses of everyday life. It was a barren and dangerous land, a place of temptation and trial and tribulation. Having been put to the test, they had “murmured” and rebelled against God. Yet it was also a place of hope, symbolized each year after the spring rains when it was carpeted with glorious flowers. That hope is now at fever pitch as through John’s preaching they are encouraged to await the one who is to come.

Advent is a time of waiting. We are waiting for one who has come and yet is still to come again. John the Baptist calls *us* to make a “way of the LORD”. In the journey to the Promised Land the Lord showed his people the way, guiding them with a pillar of cloud and a column of fire. But God’s ways are not our ways and it is therefore not *our* path or way we are to prepare but God’s.

How can we know the way? By letting our hearts enter into the silence of the wilderness, the silence of God. The book of Wisdom says, “For when peaceful stillness encompassed everything and the night in its swift course was half spent, Your all-powerful word from heaven’s royal throne leapt into the doomed land” (18:14-15). The Word of God, Christ who is the Way, the Truth and the Life, was born into this world in the silence of the night, and it is in silence and stillness that we can begin to discover the path to the mystery of the nativity. These days of Advent are given that we may set apart time to listen to the voice of God; and that by listening we may discover Christ anew and follow him.

May God *always* be pleased with us!

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

Advent is already upon us. As Church and school, we prepare for Christ's coming in history, mystery, and majesty.



A family came to visit our convent. The little ones gathered around the nativity scene. The smallest started giggling. He pulled the sweater of his tall dad. The father bent down and made himself the size of his tiny son. The boy pointed at the manger and whispered, "These sisters are silly. They forgot baby Jesus!"

We did not forget. We traditionally wait until Christmas Eve to place the Babe in the crib. This is our recognition of Christ coming in history. It is the easiest part of Advent for children to understand.

But Advent prepares us for Christ's continuing to come to us in mystery. This is a harder part and thus called mystery. Christ is indeed among us! Through grace, He is here with us in the love we share with one another, in the scriptures, and in the Eucharist. One very good Advent practice is to find good to celebrate in someone else. Where is Jesus in this person? How can we love the Christ in others? Children practice seeing Jesus in the love of their parents, friends, and teachers.

Finally, Advent prepares us to celebrate Christ's coming in majesty. In a day and age of instant, quick, and plenty, majesty is a foreign concept. Majesty goes beyond kings and queens. It is the anticipation of the coming of Christ at the end of time. And so we have children checking their soul to make an appropriate home for a King such as our God. What virtues can we cultivate? What gift can we offer to honor Him?

As you begin your Advent journey, remember the three comings. We will be praying for you and ask that you pray for us as well.
