## FEBRUARY 22, 2015 - FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

Recently I read that the native tribes of South America make a point of marking different events in a person's life in dramatic fashion. In a time honored tradition their young men are initiated into the tribe in a private ceremony. They will eventually receive honorable status in their society but not before they have endured differing rituals designed to test their strength, and, perhaps humble them a little. There are many rites of passage for different occasions. Somehow these help them become loving and caring husbands and tribesmen. These societies have no doubt learned that the only way humanity moves forward is when we have the courage to face our weakness and our fears.

Like Saint Matthew and Saint Luke, Saint Mark in today's Gospel Lesson shows Jesus going through a time of testing. Each account, in a different way, tells us that he has to endure his strengthening, his initiation, before he could preach his message of salvation. The spirit that leads him to the wilderness is the same spirit that will tell him he is a beloved son. His preparation to do the will of the Father will not be complete until he spends those hungry days alone with his thoughts, finding out who he is.

To the people of the day, the wilderness of the desert was a lonely place, cut off from the support of one's family. How could one survive this experience, vulnerable and exposed to danger? In fact, Jesus is facing those demons that we all must face at some time in our lives, the terrible vulnerability of aloneness, and the inevitability of death. His days alone were a foretaste of the cross to come. Of course we know that this testing leads to freedom and through the cross, to redemption. Since we are baptized into Christ, we too can overcome the obstacles that may confront us. We can rest safe in the knowledge that Christ has overcome even death itself.

Perhaps like Noah in our Old Testament Lesson, we cannot fully understand what real freedom looks like until we experience vulnerability. As the early Christian mystics say, we cannot understand the language of the cross, until we have faced darkness in our own lives. To be a builder of the kingdom means being a person of compassion and that is not learned without suffering. Life brings with it many forms of testing, for some it may be an embittering experience, leaving them cold and closed. For us as people of the promise, it can be a turning point, a cleansing experience that leads us to growth and openness. This freedom can only come about if we, like Jesus, remember that we are beloved by the Father who is with us at every stage of our journey. Like Jesus, we are accompanied by a Father who is intimately involved in our joys and our moments of weakness.

In this season of Lent, the Church asks us to spend time looking within ourselves. During the coming weeks we are to confront our fears and temptations, so that we might be brought into a fuller relationship with Christ. The Gospel reminds us that the Father who strengthens his son in the desert is the same God who renews the promises to an unfaithful people and is bound with them forever. This is the good news that we all need to hear, and are all called to share.

What does this good news look like? Well we know it transforms people, it makes them turn around, repent, and start again. It gives hope; it drives away fear; it promotes true peace; it is concerned for others; it is concerned with building up what is good, and destroying what is evil. When we begin to see this work of God in our lives, when we respond anew, we will find life: life in all its fullness.

May God always be pleased with us!

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

One of my favorite spiritual directors is fond of reminding me that "God is in the details." I am one who likes to paint with broad strokes. The details are something that I leave to the rest of the world. That being said, I really thought he was telling me to pay attention to the details when I undertook a project and the details of life and prayer.

But I have come to discover that this is not at all what he meant. My mission is to use love as the building blocks of the Kingdom in my lifetime. I am not in the details of what I do. God is in the details of what He does. He is in the giggles of the children walking through the 100 pennants hung on the third grade door.

When the teacher is hit with family tragedies, God is in the detail of the rest of the faculty picking up her after school duties so she has time to grieve appropriately. When little fingers come turn blue curling around a backpack on a cold day, God is in the detail of the little friend who gives up one glove to warm another's hand.

I find myself looking at the details that surround me here at St. Ann School. God is surely alive and present. A bus company may cancel a route, but God is in the help that gets children to school anyway. A child may forget homework and a teacher may sign a discipline calendar, but God is in the detail of growing in responsibility and forgiveness. God does not ask for perfectionism. But He loves orchestrating those serendipitous acts provide the details to show us the way.

For the details God works through you for our school, thank you. Your kindness to our children, your support of families, your outreach and prayers, do not go unnoticed. They are indeed made divine by His design. That is what Catholic education is all about.
