PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we the Catholic Parish of St. Ann embrace all as family & continue Christ's mission by exemplifying the love of God & neighbor as stewards of God's gifts to us.

MARRIAGES:

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least **One Year** before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

BAPTISM:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes **6 months** of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

LAZARUS MINISTRY:

Lazarus Ministry contacts and helps families of deceased parishioners. Providing greeters at funeral liturgies, preparing meals and house sitting are several ways parishioners assist families. Also, a Mass of Remembrance is held every November for those deceased that year.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK:

Parishioners who are homebound are visited on the first Friday of each month by our Deacons & Religious. If you know of a parishioner that is seriously ill or hospitalized, please call the rectory.

TWELVETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JUNE 21, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We often forget how difficult it was as a child to learn certain skills; for example, riding a bicycle. After years of cycling there may seem to be nothing to it. Yet if we develop a problem with our balance, cycling can become an impossible task. The same is true for life in general. A period of illness reminds us that even the most basic things we take for granted are not easy to achieve, and we wonder how we ever managed to do them.

In today's Gospel Lesson, the disciples are caught in a boat by a storm. As the boat is thrown around we can imagine them wondering what gave them the confidence to go out on the lake. At first everything seemed easy, effortless, but in the midst of the storm their confidence was shattered. What did they trust in, what gave them confidence, when they set out that evening in their boat?

The disciples had forgotten that each time we set out on a journey it is an act of trust. When the journey is potentially hazardous, we need to trust that we will overcome the hazards to reach our destination. Were the disciples really thinking about the risks as they set out that evening in the small boat? Perhaps the presence of Jesus made them believe that nothing could harm them. Jesus sleeps through the storm, and we may be inclined, like the disciples, to ask if he did not care about the danger. Yet it would be wrong to think of Jesus here as removed from ordinary human cares and fears. Rather, Jesus is able to see the storm in a different light. He lives his life as one of constant trust in his heavenly Father, and when the storm blows up he places his trust completely in his Father. This is why he asks the disciples why they have no faith. The trust Jesus has in his Father does not mean he has no cares or fears, but he knows that no matter what happens to him in this life his Father will raise him to eternal life.

We might think that the disciples would have learned their lesson: to see the need to live each moment of life placing their trust in God, particularly when things are most desperate. Later in the Gospel of Mark, at the time when Jesus is suffering his agony in the garden, it is the disciples who sleep while Jesus is assailed with fears. Here we see a reversal of today's Gospel. So are we to

conclude that now it is the disciples who trust, whilst Jesus struggles? There is one crucial difference between the two accounts. Jesus sleeps because he trusts in his Father; however, the disciples sleep because they are oblivious to what is about to happen. If we lack trust in God, then either we live our lives in constant terror, or we find ways to blot out our fears. In most cases we swing between these two states: one minute overcome with fear, the next oblivious to the dangers around us. The disciples will awake from their sleep to the terrors of the crucifixion. But this will not be the end, for through his cross and resurrection Jesus will restore us to a relationship of trust with his Father.

In his death on the cross Jesus Christ takes all our fears upon himself and restores us to a relationship of trust in his Father. This does not mean we have no more fears, but it does enable us to live our lives with the assurance that the Father will raise up with his Son, those who trust in him.

We can be like the disciples setting out in the boat. We can become oblivious to the fragility of life, to the risks that surround us. When something happens that throws us off balance we can become overwhelmed by fears. All we took for granted seems to be threatened, like a boat in a storm. At such times we are called to place our trust in God, but we cannot do this ourselves. It is Jesus Christ who enables us to trust in his Father. He takes our fears on himself, and brings us the hope of new life. This does not mean that our problems will be solved; rather, we know that no matter how desperate things become for us, Christ is with us and will never leave us.

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely—visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died, especially Isabell Mendrick, Gregorio Ruffa and Allie DeLucia who died last week. Also, pray for the souls of all the faithful departed of our Parish Family.

May God always be pleased with us!
