## PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

## MARRIAGES:

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least **One Year** before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

## BAPTISM:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

## SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes **6 months** of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

## LAZARUS MINISTRY:

Lazarus Ministry contacts and helps families of deceased parishioners. Providing greeters at funeral liturgies, preparing meals and house sitting are several ways parishioners assist families. Also, a Mass of Remembrance is held every November for those deceased that year.

## THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JUNE 28, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Jamie was a boisterous teenager, always ready to try out something new, a bit lazy at school but up to date with the latest fashions, music, technology and sport. But it all came to a sudden end when he and a few friends borrowed a car and crashed it into a tree. The others escaped; Jamie didn't. His family was devastated. He may have been a pain in the neck in the last few years, but he was still their Jamie. They struggled to live without him. The funeral passed in a blur, and people were very supportive. Afterwards they just did not know what to do. Friends drifted away, somehow discerning their struggle and not being able to respond. They stopped talking, they stopped touching, they couldn't smile.

Then, totally unexpectedly, Jamie's mother gave birth to another boy, and they called him Jamie after his dead brother. They knew he wasn't Jamie, but he seemed to be a gift. He healed their lives. His mother said that his first look was both calm and penetrating, like that of an "old soul", but he wasn't old in his ways. He taught them to touch again, loving to be held and played with and thrown around, loving to hug them in return once he was old enough. He taught them to smile again, laughing and playing peek-a-boo, and seeming to have a sixth sense of what each family member needed to cheer them. Once he could talk he never stopped, commenting in wonder on everything and everyone he encountered but also constantly bringing the family into conversation and debate. It was on his first day of school that it suddenly dawned on his mother that both she and all the others were alive again, not just alive but more fully aware and appreciative of what it meant to live than they had ever been.

In today's Gospel Lesson, Jesus offers us two examples of healing and new life through faith. In both cases touch plays a central role. First, Jairus, the synagogue official, asks Jesus to come and lay his hands on his little girl to make her better and save her life. There is no practice of such a laying on of hands in the traditions of the Old Testament, but it would become a practice used throughout the early Church and taken over by Christian monarchs, who would lay their hands on those suffering from scrofula and other diseases of

the skin. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the priest lays his hands in silence on the sick person before the oil is applied to head and hands.

Then the woman suffering from the haemorrhage knows she has to touch Jesus for healing, even though such an act in Jewish law will make him unclean because of her condition. In this Lesson, Jesus commends her faith, a faith that has enabled her to put her trust in him and go beyond the accepted boundaries of convention. In later Greek tradition the woman was given the name Bernice, which translates into the Latin Veronica, the woman who in the Stations of the Cross wipes the face of Jesus on his journey to Calvary, leaving the imprint of that face on the cloth.

We are taught both to receive life from Jesus and to convey his gift of life to others. We are invited to be touched by him and remain in touch with him. Without his love in our hearts we are not fully alive, and we are certainly not able to offer that love to others. Our hearts and minds are touched as we listen to his word during the Scripture Lessons, and we are nourished spiritually as we receive the gift of his Body and Blood in Holy Communion. As we exchange the kiss of peace, our embracing of each other reminds us that we are the body of Christ, literally in touch with each other. By the simple act of a handshake, a bow or kiss we proclaim the peace that exists between us. We acknowledge, too, that this peace is also his gift, flowing from the risen Lord who awaits us in Holy Communion. These same acts flow out into our lives. We may not be, for the most part, doctors or nurses, but the way we greet each other, the way we smile, the way we listen, the way we hold each other in friendship or compassion, are all carrying out the love of Christ and our witness to him.

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely—visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died.

May God always be pleased with us!
