Parishioners who are homebound are visited on the first Friday of each month by our Deacons & Religious. If you know of a parishioner that is seriously ill or hospitalized, please call the parish office.

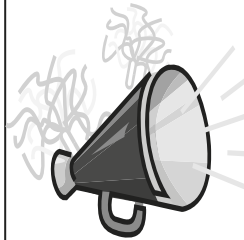

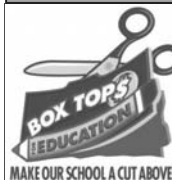

MARCH 1, 2015 - SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In 1940 Brother Roger Schutz founded a Christian community in Taizé, France. The community grew and became a major spiritual centre for young people, and now attracts 100,000 young people each year. For many of these young people this is their first experience of intensive prayer, and they experience the presence of Christ in a powerful manner. This encounter can stir up deep emotions and often the young people do not know how to react. The community at Taizé offers help and guidance, which aims to help them make sense of their encounter with Christ but also to reflect upon what this will mean when they leave Taizé and return to their lives.

Many would like to remain in Taizé and never let go of this experience of Christ's presence. Yet our vocation as Christians is not one of flight from the world. For those who do remain there is no flight from reality. Welcoming 100,000 young people each year requires a great deal of planning and work, especially when you are faced with all their needs: physical, emotional, intellectual and spiritual. For the Brothers of Taizé, sharing the lives of the young people requires a commitment to the cross. Many of the young people who arrive in Taizé have broken lives, and welcoming them means sharing in their sorrow and pain.

The encounter of Peter, James and John upon the mountain with the glorious Christ in today's Gospel Lesson, seems out of place in the Gospel of St. Mark. Why are they given this vision of the glorious risen Christ before the cross and resurrection? We can, however, turn the question around. Why are the disciples not able to see the glory of Christ at every moment? He is the Son of God, the Word through whom all things are made. Why can they not see this? It is because they have not accepted that Jesus must die on the cross.

After they come down from the mountain Jesus commands them to tell nobody about what has happened until after "the Son of Man [has] risen from the dead". They do not understand what Jesus means by this saying. But we, the readers of St. Mark's Gospel, are now seeing

all this in the light of the cross and resurrection. We know that without the cross there can be no resurrection. It is only after Jesus has risen that the disciples will understand the significance of what happened upon the mountain. The mountain of the glorious appearance of Jesus only makes sense in the light of that other mountain, Golgotha, the place of the crucifixion. On the cross Christ shares all our pain and suffering; this is Christ's glory.

When we think of earthly glory we think of those who have risen above our ordinary human weakness and vulnerability. The great sportsperson never experiences the disappointments of the ordinary competitor. Those who are rich and famous do not share in our daily struggles to make a living. Sometimes we think that sharing in the glory of Christ will make us invulnerable to human weakness and suffering. With St. Peter we say that it is wonderful to be with the glorified Christ, and we wish to build a dwelling place so that Christ can stay forever with us. Yet remaining with Christ means following him to that other mountain, the place of the cross. Jesus enters into glory not through rising above our suffering, but by embracing it.

In order to enter into his glory, Christ calls us to follow him on the path to the cross. It is very tempting to remain on the mountain, but we are called to return to our lives. Each of us is confronted by suffering: the pain and disappointments of our own lives, the sufferings of those around us. Even a few moments in the presence of the risen Christ can bring us relief from such suffering. But this is not because Christ does not share in our sufferings. Rather, it is because Christ enters into and transforms our sufferings

As Christians we are not called to rise above the pain and suffering of the world, but to follow Christ and enter into those places where people suffer. We can only do this as Christ's disciples, allowing him to enter into our own suffering and pain, so that we can show to others this healing love. This is what it means to show the glory of Christ.

Our Scripture Lessons remind us:

- ...that an encounter with the risen Christ does not mean flying from the world but sharing in the sufferings of the world;**
- ...that when Peter, James and John see the glorified Christ on the mountain they do not understand that Jesus must suffer on the cross in order to enter into glory;**
- ...and that we also struggle to accept that sharing in the glory of Christ means following the path of the cross.**

ST. ANN SCHOOL NEWS

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

Watching the faith development of our children is truly a humbling experience. When I first started to teach, I thought that it was our little ones, so pure and simple, who were the leaders of our faith.



The young members strive so hard to be good. They radiate holiness and wonder. As they approach the priest for a blessing at communion time, their faces are full of awe. It is almost as if those who are not yet permitted to receive Christ in Holy Communion are more aware of His presence than the rest of us. But, I have discovered that these young ones have a pure faith, indeed, but it is an untried and untested faith.

As the children get older they come to have a black and white faith. Things are quickly assessed and categorized as good and bad. There is no in between for these developing Christians. These children are the moral compass of the school.

But then they begin to use the weighted scale of their conscience in a different way. They question the rightness, the wrongness and the consequences of actions. They test the waters of their faith and even the patience of those bringing the faith to them.

And we adults are there, having had our questions answered by life with the Lord. We see things no less clearly but definitely differently from the children described. We can say with full confidence that we have chosen the faith we now live. Our faith has been tested by the trials of life. It is no longer a flat, paper and pencil faith. It is something that causes us to get out of bed and seek the good of others as a life time endeavor. Our faith is now all about relationships but God, others, and ourselves.

Your example of adult faith is extremely important to the school children. The reverence we see on the faces of the Pre K children are but a reflection of the reverence they have observed in you. The belief and acceptance of the bread and wine transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus are in imitation of the faith they see in you and your actions.

This Lent, I invite you to evangelize our children by your words and example. No matter their age or yours, we are one in Christ. The holiness of the school can only be as sure as the holiness of the parish and its parishioners. Be it Stations of the Cross, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, a Rosary said after Mass, the meatless Friday meal, or the jar of change you're accumulating for the poor, we are observing you and imitating your example. Thank you for making concrete and real what we desire for ourselves in our future.
