#### Parish Mission Statement

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we the Catholic Parish of St. Ann embrace all as family & continue Christ's mission by exemplifying the love of God & neighbor as stewards of God's gifts to us.

#### **MARRIAGES:**

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least <u>One Year</u> before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

#### Baptism:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

#### **SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:**

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes <u>6 months</u> of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

#### **LAZARUS MINISTRY:**

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

For centuries, people puzzled over the meaning of the hieroglyphs---the pictorial writing found in ancient Egypt, especially in its temples and the tombs of the pharaohs. But the knowledge of the meaning of hieroglyphic writing was lost, with apparently no means of deciphering the symbols. That was until the discovery of the Rosetta Stone in a village in the Nile Delta in 1799.

Carved onto this stone slab is a decree issued in 196 BC in the reign of Pharaoh Ptolemy V. The decree is written in three different types of script, so that all citizens could read it ---in Greek (the language of the ruling class), in the ordinary Egyptian writing of the time and, crucially, also in hieroglyphs---the ancient religious language of Egypt. With these three written versions of the same text, plus his own knowledge of the Egyptian Coptic language, the gifted French linguist Jean-François Champollion labored for years until he finally succeeded in deciphering the hieroglyphs in 1822. As a result, the Rosetta Stone is regarded as the key to unlocking the secrets not just of ancient Egyptian language but also of the culture underlying that language.

The Scripture Lessons for today's feast of Pentecost, each in their own way, describe the effect of God's Holy Spirit in terms of speaking a language, of understanding a culture. The apostles are transformed from being huddled in the upper room in fear of their lives into people who are filled with joy and courage as they rush out to share the good news of the resurrection of Jesus and the coming of God's Holy Spirit. They speak foreign languages, they are given the gift of speech. Sometimes this event is understood as a reversal of the ancient story of the Tower of Babel, in which the diversity of human language is viewed as a curse, arising from humanity's swollen pride. The result was that people could no longer understand each other or work together. The coming of the Spirit overcomes this: not by suppressing the different languages and cultures, but by enabling all people to understand the Gospel message, each in their own language. The Spirit acts as a kind of Rosetta Stone, enabling people from diverse backgrounds and ethnicities to hear about "the marvels of God" and translate the message into their own lives, apply it to their own situations.

In the Gospel Lesson, Jesus describes the Spirit as the one who speaks the truth---acting as a witness to the truth about Jesus. Throughout St. John's Gospel, the truth about Jesus is quite simply that Jesus is the Son of God. The Spirit continues to speak this truth---to bear witness to it. Now, the Spirit enables the apostles to do this too. Like the Rosetta Stone, the Spirit is the key, enabling the apostles to understand the meaning of who Jesus is and what he has done. The Spirit enables them to speak the language of God's love---to understand the "culture of God", who sent the Son not to condemn the world but so that through him the world might be saved. With the Spirit speaking through them, the apostles can translate God's love so that all people can hear and accept it.

Champollion worked for years to be able to decipher the hieroglyphs of the Rosetta Stone. No one can learn a language in an instant. In the same way, the Spirit leads the followers of Christ into the complete truth---a gradual process in our personal lives and as a community of faith. Through practicing it, we come to speak the language of God's love.

How do we know if we are speaking that language? St. Paul gives a vivid description of those who speak the language of the Spirit and those who don't. Indecency, sexual irresponsibility, envy, drunkenness, bad temper---these are sure signs that a person has not learned the language of God. But when God's Spirit lives in us, then what we are able to express comes from that core of our being---a language that is as beautiful as it is clear, because it comes from God: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness. St. Paul simply tells us to be what are, to live out what we have become: we are to live by the Spirit. Or, put another way, since the Spirit has taught us how to speak, let our lives speak the language of God, the language of love.

May God always be pleased with us!

Dear Friends of St. Ann School,

This Memorial Day Weekend, I share the winning entry of the Veterans Essay Contest, "Why I Appreciate Veterans?" Seventh grader Joseph Gorky wrote the following essay, one of over 5,500 entries.

However, from the beginning of our nation's history, our rights were being fought for and defended by veterans, including our first President, George Washington. In fact, veterans are a big part of why this country is standing today and I would like to say thank you. These men and women risked their lives for each of us. I will always appreciate veterans for what they have done for me and you.

I am grateful that we celebrate Veteran's Day each year to honor these special people. I proudly salute them for their service. After all, the United States is the "home of the free, because of the brave."

Thank you for your continued support of Joseph and our school. And thank you to all who are serving or have served in our country. Our freedom to choose a Catholic school comes from your bravery.
