PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we the Catholic Parish of St. Ann embrace all as family & continue Christ's mission by exemplifying the love of God & neighbor as stewards of God's gifts to us.

MARRIAGES:

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements be made at least **One Year** before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Bride or Groom must be a parishioner. Please do not make any arrangements until you have met with the pastor, Msgr. Corona, and the wedding date has been approved.

BAPTISM:

First Sunday of the month at the Noon Mass, as well as the second, third and fourth Sunday at 1:30pm. Instruction for new parents takes place on the second Saturday of the month at 10am. Arrangements are made with the rectory.

SPONSORS & GODPARENTS:

Must be 18 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a sponsor for Confirmation or a Godparent for Baptism. It takes **6 months** of attending Mass to be eligible for both of these privileges.

LAZARUS MINISTRY:

Lazarus Ministry contacts and helps families of deceased parishioners. Providing greeters at funeral liturgies, preparing meals and house sitting are several ways parishioners assist families. Also, a Mass of Remembrance is held every November for those deceased that year.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK:

Parishioners who are homebound are visited on the first Friday of each month by our Deacons & Religious. If you know of a parishioner that is seriously ill or hospitalized, please call the rectory.

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - OCTOBER 4, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

There is a story from early Christian history, which tells of a holy man, much given to disciplined prayer and fasting, who goes on a journey, taking with him a Gallic peasant as a companion and servant. The going is tough, especially for the servant who carries the luggage and food. Eventually the servant asks the holy man if they might stop and eat, to renew their strength. The response is not what he is looking for. "The angels in heaven", the holy man points out, "need no food or rest, but are strengthened by the praise of God." The Gallic response is sharp and to the point--and perhaps more theologically and spiritually wise: "Yes, but we are men! We are foolish to pretend we are angels when we are not!"

This may seem an odd way to begin reflection on today's Lessons, which are focused on marriage, first in creation and then in Christian life. Yet the questions of how the most intimate daily living of our relationships can be blessed are based in a deeper place--the graced gift of creation and the living of holy life as a bodily matter. This is the lesson that the holy man needed to learn from his more "earthy" companion--and it can be a lesson of hope and renewal for us today. It is the fundamental learning needed for blessed marriages and family relationships, and for human friendships more widely.

The lesson of holiness as a bodily concern is not an easy one for any generation to learn. The Pharisees who come to Jesus to ask about the painful and controversial question of divorce--a question that has troubled men and women for thousands of years, we should note--don't come seeking help or wisdom. Rather, "They were testing him." The tragedy is that too often the most precious and intimate places of human living can become battlegrounds for different ideas and ideologies; the human realities and stories are lost. Jesus recognises, above all, the non-ideal ways in which people order their lives: the Mosaic laws around divorce were a kind of necessary but regrettable sign of sin and weakness for Jesus. Yet, for all this, he reminds us again of the graced intention of God in creation, that "the two become one body".

As the second reading reminds us, it is this flesh, with all its suffering and limitations, that Jesus takes up in his own life, as one who is without sin, who is God. Bodily holiness in this

fallen world, even for the human person who is most perfect, the one who is God, is not an easy matter; even here, perfection comes through suffering. For us sinners it can feel impossible. But the news is good: in Jesus' own living "in the flesh" we become his sisters and brothers. He embraces us, touches us with his welcome. This is the same embrace and welcome he gives the small, insignificant children whom the disciples had turned away in the Gospel.

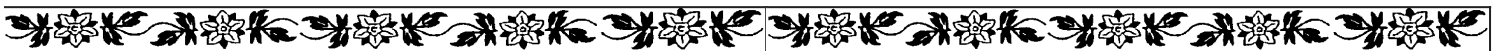
Perhaps the problem with the ordinary things of "the body" and the intimate family relationships that are referred to in today's readings is that they are so ordinary. We take them for granted. Yet the mystery is there in our faith: a mystery of being of a piece with the created world, and, at the same time, that part of creation which is made in God's image, the part that names and recognises all the other parts and gives thanks. In our humanity we are called to sanctify in Christ the whole of creation, including our domestic living.

After Mass today we will be returning to our homes. For most of us this will include families of one kind or another, in which we experience love and care, but also struggles, clashes and tensions. For others these closest of human relationships will be less immediate, being "stretched" over distances, or fractured through time, or held in the mysterious separation of death. Fed by today's scriptures, we are each called to find small ways in which these relationships can find afresh the touch and embrace that reflects Jesus' own welcome and care. It might be a hug, or some kind of help in the home; it could be a phone call, or even just a smile. Small, "ordinary", bodily things; but the marks, too, of holiness embodied in loving relationship.

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely - visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died, especially, Bobby Forte. Also, pray for the souls of the faithful departed of our Parish Family.

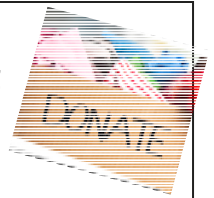

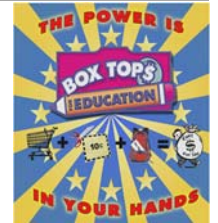

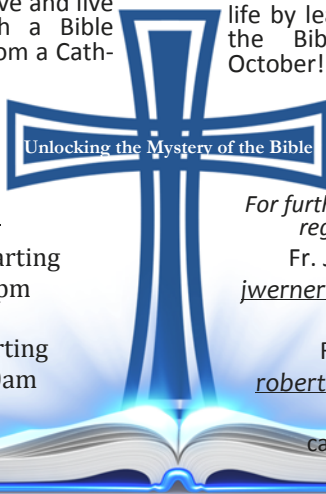
