## 21 SEPTEMBER, 2014 —THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In Christian teaching envy and greed are counted among the seven deadly sins. In the world of capitalism they are often seen as the essential driving forces in making the world go round. In the realm of psychology they are evoked as elements in our human growth, elements that ultimately block that growth if not balanced by generosity and gratitude.

In the first volume of his great novel *In Search of Lost Time*, the French author Marcel Proust explores at depth the feeling of jealousy. Swann, a man of the world, falls unexpectedly in love with Odette, a starlet he would not normally have noticed. Proust examines how the relationship develops out of nothing but develops into Swann's overwhelming concern to know everything about Odette and to control every moment of her day. Eventually they marry and have a daughter, at which point Swann's interest lessens and he becomes his old independent self, he and his wife now living parallel lives. Odette's feelings are not really revealed; she is like a blank page on which Swann creates his own imaginings. For Proust, jealousy is given the shape of a disease, which like a fever can shake the whole human frame and then eventually recede. We are all capable of succumbing to this disease. Some, however, would doubt that we recover so easily. They would argue that jealousy is more of a personality trait and can remain part of a person's behavior, no matter how much tolerance, understanding and gratitude are fed into the balance.

The parable of the laborers in the vineyard in our Gospel Lesson is one of the most difficult ones for a modern audience to appreciate. With our concerns for social justice it is well nigh impossible to read the parable except through the lens of work relations. How can it be just that those who have worked for only an hour are paid the same as those who have labored through the heat of the day? Our knee-jerk reactions are on the side of those complaining. It is the same sort of complaint we hear from people who have led exemplary lives only to be hit with ill health, economic woes and personal tragedies. "Why is God doing this to me?" they ask. "It isn't fair."

However, what Jesus wants to reveal through his use of parables is not what is fair and what isn't but

rather what enhances the presence of the kingdom of God and what blocks it. In today's parable the generosity of the master is contrasted with miserliness and envy of the workers. The kingdom of God is a place of forgiveness and generosity, not a place of greed and envy. The parables face us with a tough challenge. Can we understand and can we live in the way God lives? Or are we going to be ever caught in the vicious and closed circles created by envy, jealousy and greed?

For the disciple of Christ, envy and greed are not just addictions or illnesses. They create an obstacle in our way of understanding God and in our freedom to follow God's guidance. In this they have their use. As we experience them tugging at our hearts and at our decisions, we are invited to deepen our appreciation of what is asked of us as followers of Christ. Each of us is tested in different ways. The tests, however, always have a similar aim in view. We are asked to free ourselves from the patterns that close down our openness to God and to others and to favour patterns that increase that openness.

Envy and greed are self-centred. They lead us to want as much as possible for ourselves, and to think that what another has is something I should have. It is true that such a world-view often emerges from our own sense of emptiness. Not having any sense of our fulfilment, we look elsewhere to fill the gap, but the gap is never filled. Instead we can look to the Lord and his teachings, for his grace and his guidance reveal a way forward in this labyrinth. The move to a greater generosity of spirit and a delight in what others achieve and have is a major step forward in human and spiritual growth. If we can do that, we can break the vicious circle of envy and greed and become fully alive in the kingdom of God.

In your charity, pray for the sick and the lonely—visit them if you can. Please remember to pray for all who have wandered from the Faith and all who have died. Also, pray for the souls of all the faithful departed of our Parish Family.

May God *always* be pleased with us!

SOCIAL MINISTRY



IHN is Interfaith Hospitality Network- helping families get back on their feet. IHN works with families who are the diverse homeless. Today's homeless condition goes beyond the stereotypes of bag ladies and skid row derelicts. The fastest growing segment of the homeless population is families with children, including the 'working poor.' These are

parents who are working but cannot afford shelter and basic needs. The majority of IHN parents are single women but single men with children and couples are served too. Lack of a living wage, no access to affordable housing, unemployment and the effects of abuse and illness are some of the causes that have forced IHN clients from their homes.

The families are hosted by local churches to receive evening meals, fellowship and a warm place to sleep. During the day, IHN helps them with daily living. St. Ann's supports IHN through preparing meals, fellowship, and companionship. We partner with a local church where we prepare evening meals and stay until the night shift arrives to take over. This is only a few nights per year and we are in need of more volunteers and a new Ministry Head for IHN to represent St. Ann church.
